How local power can imagine sustainable solutions to global issues?

What can local powers do in terms of sustainable transition? Which sustainable solutions can a municipality imagine to reduce its ecological footprint? Marie-Monique Robin's documentary "Qu'est-ce qu'on attend" (What are we waiting for ?) offers answers to these questions by showing the example of Ungersheim, a 2200 inhabitant town in Alsace which has been multiplying initiatives in terms of food, energy, transports, work, money, accommodation and education, with the aim to increase its food and energy autonomy.

A panel discussion involving French and Finnish officials, who will be able to showcase the measures that have been implemented in their respective municipalities and worldwide will take place for an hour before the screening.

This event will be opened by the Coordinator of the UN Development Policy and Agenda at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Mr Pasi PÖYSÄRI.

Anni SINNEMÄKI, Deputy Mayor of Helsinki



Ms. Anni Milja Maaria Sinnemäki was born 20 July, 1973 in Helsinki. In December 2014 Ms. Sinnemäki was appointed as the Deputy Mayor for the City of Helsinki, responsible for City Planning and Real Estate. Since June 2017 she is in charge of Helsinki's Urban Environment Division, which includes City Planning and Real Estate. She was Member of Parliament for 15 years, representing The Green League of Finland (1999 to 2015). Ms. Sinnemäki was Member in the Council of State as Minister of Labour from 2009 to 2011 i.e. 2 years. She has been Member of the City Council since 2005. She has published two collections of poems "Sokeana hetkenä" (2003) and "Aleksis Kiven katu" (2009) and she also wrote lyrics for albums by Ultra Bra group. Ms. Sinnemäki holds a degree from the University of Helsinki, 2001, Faculty of Arts, Bachelor of Arts, her main subject was Russian literature.

Annika LINDBLOM, Secretary General, National Commission on Sustainable Development, Finland



Ms. Annika Lindblom works in the Ministry of the Environment of Finland as Secretary General of the Prime Minister led National Commission on Sustainable Development and as Counsellor for International Affairs. She leads the coordination of the national implementation of the 2030 Agenda in cooperation with the Prime Minister's Office and takes operational responsibility in the work of the multi-stakeholder National Commission. She also works with the international aspects of the follow up and review of the 2030 Agenda, especially as regards topics on sustainable consumption and production, circular and green economy. Ms. Lindblom belonged to Finland's negotiation team during the Rio+20, Open-Ended Working Group on SDGs and Post-2015 processes, leading to the adoption of the 2030 Agenda. She is political scientist by education.

Ronan DANTEC, Senator of Loire-Atlantique, France



Elected to the French Senate for the Loire-Atlantique region in September 2011, Ronan Dantec is Vice President of the Sustainable Development, Infrastructures, Utilities and Land Planning Commission. Furthermore, Ronan Dantec is the spokesman for the international organization 'United Cities and Local Governments' (UCLG) in the international negotiations on climate, President of the climate working group of the network of European cities Eurocities, and President of the environmental commission of French Association of the Council of European Municipalities and Regions (AFCCRE). He was in charge of a parliamentary mission on the role of local and regional authorities in climate negotiations to prepare for the Paris Climat 2015 Summit, which was presented in September 2013. Vice President of Nantes Metropole, in charge of the climate plan from 2001 to 2011, he actively supported the dossier « Nantes, 2013 Green Capital of Europe ».
