What is DELF?

DELF (Diplôme d'Études de Langue Française – Diploma of French language studies) is issued by the French Ministry of National Education to certify the language proficiency. It has a life-long validity and it is approved internationally by many educational and professional institutions.

Based on the action-oriented approach and the principles of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, DELF assesses the proficiency of learners of foreign languages in reading, listening, writing and speaking. DELF Prim and DELF Junior are two versions of the exam that are suitable for children and teenagers: the language levels tested are the same throughout all the versions, but the tasks and situations are adapted to the candidates.

DELF Prim is particularly suitable for children aged 6 to 10 and assesses levels A1.1, A1 and A2.

DELF Junior is particularly suitable for children and teenagers aged 11 to 17 and assesses levels A1, A2, B1 and B2.
